22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B Theme: "What Truly Makes Us Clean" by Fr. Emmauel

In our Gospel reading for today, Jesus teaches that it is not the external things like unwashed hands that defile a person, but the thoughts and intentions of the heart. The heart is the seat of our intentions, and it is from the heart that our actions and behaviors flow. The reading calls us to look inward, to examine the motivations and desires that drive our actions.

Jesus' words invite us to a deeper understanding of what it means to live a life of faith. It is not enough to follow religious practices superficially; we are called to cultivate a sincere and genuine relationship with God. Our actions should be reflections of a heart that is aligned with God's love and justice.

In a world where external appearances often take precedence, this teaching reminds us of the importance of authenticity. Are we focusing too much on outward displays of piety while neglecting the inner transformation that God wants? True holiness is not about checking off religious duties but about allowing God's grace to purify and renew us from the inside out.

Let this week be an opportunity to ask ourselves where our hearts stand. Are we harboring bitterness, anger, or deceit? Are we letting these negative traits dictate our actions? Jesus offers us a chance to clean the inside of the cup, to align our hearts with His love, and to live out our faith with genuine integrity.

May we be inspired to seek a purity that comes from a heart transformed by God's grace. As we strive to live out our faith authentically, let us remember that our relationship with God is not about mere rituals but about a heart that seeks Him above all else.
