Reflection for the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B Theme: Greatness in the eyes of God

This Sunday's readings invite us to reflect on what it truly means to be great in the eyes of God. In our Gospel reading, we see the disciples arguing about who is the greatest among them. Jesus responds by placing a child in their midst, teaching them that greatness in the Kingdom of God is not about power or status but about humility and service.

As we reflect on this passage, it challenges us to examine our own lives. Are we, too, caught up in the quest for recognition and achievement? In a world that often values success and prominence, Jesus calls us to a different standard, one that prioritizes love, humility, and the well-being of others. Our first reading from the book of Wisdom highlights the tensions that arise when we choose to live righteously. The righteous are often met with resistance, much like Jesus and His disciples. Yet, it is in these challenges that we are called to remain steadfast in our commitment to justice and truth, embodying the servant leadership that Jesus exemplifies.

As we reflect on our own ambitions and desires, let us remember the call to serve rather than be served. How can we embrace the humility of a child in our daily interactions? Are we willing to put others first, to listen deeply, and to act with compassion?

In this week ahead, let us strive to embody the values of the Kingdom of God by serving those around us, especially the marginalized and the overlooked. May we find joy in lifting others up and seeking greatness in acts of kindness and love.
