Father Emmanuel's Reflection for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B Theme: The nature of true Leadership

In our Gospel reading for today, we see James and John approach Jesus with a request for positions of honor in His kingdom. Their ambition reveals a common human desire for recognition and power. However, Jesus responds not with affirmation but with a challenge to their understanding of greatness.

He teaches them that true leadership is found in service. "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant," He says. This flips our usual understanding of success and authority on its head. Instead of striving for power over others, Jesus invites us to embody humility and selflessness.

In a world often obsessed with status, we are called to reflect on our own motivations. Are we seeking to elevate ourselves, or are we willing to serve those around us? This is especially relevant in our relationships, workplaces, and communities.

Jesus reminds us that He Himself came "not to be served but to serve." This radical call to servanthood challenges us to rethink our priorities. It asks us to consider how we can support and uplift others, particularly those who are marginalized or in need.

As we meditate on this message, let us ask ourselves: How can I serve others in my daily life? What small acts of kindness can I offer that reflect Christ's love? In doing so, we not only follow His example but also find deeper fulfillment in our own lives.

May we embrace the call to serve with open hearts, recognizing that in serving others, we truly encounter Christ.
