Reflection for 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Theme: Trust in God

Life often teaches us to measure success by wealth, comfort, and security. Yet, in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus turns that idea upside down. He speaks directly to the poor, the hungry, and those who weep, calling them blessed. Meanwhile, He warns the rich, the satisfied, and those who laugh now that their comfort is fleeting. His words are unsettling because they challenge everything the world tells us to strive for.

Jeremiah's words echo this message, reminding us that trusting in human strength alone leads to emptiness, like a bush in the desert. But when we trust in God, we become like a tree planted by water, unshaken even in times of drought. It makes me wonder, where do I

place my trust? Do I rely more on my own abilities, my status, my possessions? Or do I truly trust that God is enough for me?

Paul reminds us why this trust is not in vain. Jesus is risen, and because of that, everything changes. Our struggles, sacrifices, and moments of suffering are not meaningless. The world may see weakness, but in God's eyes, these are moments of grace. When I reflect on my own life, I see how easy it is to chase comfort and avoid struggle. But Jesus is calling me to something deeper. He's asking me to see beyond the present moment and trust in His greater plan.

This Gospel challenges us to examine our hearts. Do we find joy in God, or do we seek happiness in things that will fade? Do we stand with those who suffer, or do we turn away to protect our own comfort? Jesus' words are an invitation, not just to believe in Him, but to live differently because of that belief. Lord, help us to trust You more, to let go of what does not last, and to find our true joy in You alone.
