## Reflection for 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Theme: Love your Enemies

Loving those who love us is easy. But what about those who hurt us, betray us, or treat us unfairly? In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus gives us one of His most radical teachings: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you." These words are challenging because they go against our natural instincts. When someone wrongs me, my first reaction is often to defend myself, seek justice, or even hold a grudge. But Jesus invites us to something deeper, He calls us to love like He loves.

David's encounter with Saul in the first reading reminds us that mercy is not a sign of weakness but of strength. David had the perfect opportunity to take revenge on Saul, who was hunting him down. Instead, he chose mercy, recognizing that vengeance belongs to God alone. Let us ask ourselves, how often do we hold onto resentment when we have been wronged? Are we willing to let go of our desires for revenge and instead choose mercy?

Paul's letter to the Corinthians also reminds us that in Christ, we are called to something greater. Just as we have inherited the brokenness of Adam, we are also meant to bear the image of Christ, the one who loved us even when we were sinners. That means our love must go beyond what feels comfortable. It means forgiving when we would rather hold on to hurt. It means showing kindness even when it is not deserved.

This is not easy, but Jesus does not ask us to do it alone. He teaches us to rely on His grace, to see others through His eyes, and to trust that love is always more powerful than hatred. So today, let us ask ourselves: Who in our lives do we need to forgive? Where is God calling us to show mercy? Lord, soften our hearts and help us love as You love.

# **CLUSTER ASH WEDNESDAY MASS/DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES**

St. Mary – Tuesday, March 4, 2025, 5 pm St. Therese – Wednesday, March 5, 2025, 8:30 am Good Shepherd – Wednesday, March 5, 2025, 6 pm

Beginning Tuesday, March 11, Stations of the Cross will be recited during Lent at St. Mary at 4:30 pm before the 5 pm Tuesday Mass.

Beginning Wednesday, March 12, Stations of the Cross will be recited during Lent at Good Shepherd at 5:30 pm before the 6 pm Wednesday Mass.

## **Regulations for Fast and Abstinence During Lent**

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday, March 5 and Good Friday, April 18, are days of fast and abstinence.

**ALL** the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

### Ash Wednesday: What's with that dirt on your head?

Who hasn't gotten that question on Ash Wednesday before? Do you feel silly when people ask you about your ashes? And is it hard to answer their questions? Having ashes on your forehead isn't just some weird Catholic thing: it's a tradition that finds its roots in the Old Testament. "I turned to the Lord God, to seek help, in prayer and petition, with fasting, sackcloth, and ashes" (Daniel 9:3). When the ashes are placed on our foreheads in the sign of the Cross, it is a reminder of several things. First, it is a call to repentance: a physical sign that we are sinners in need of forgiveness, which is how the prophets used it in the Old Testament. Second, it is to remind us that God created us from the earth and when we die, we will return to it. But here's the best part: As Pope Benedict XVI has said, "Man is dust and to dust he shall return, but dust is precious in God's eyes because God created man, destining him to immortality." God so loves us that, even when our bodies return to the dust, our souls are meant to live forever with him. The ashes symbolize all of this. Not so silly anymore, is it?
