Reflection for 1st Sunday of Lent, Year C

Theme: Overcoming Temptations

As we begin this season of Lent, the Gospel takes us into the wilderness with Jesus. After fasting for forty days, He is weak and hungry, and it is in this vulnerable moment that the devil comes to tempt Him. He offers Jesus food, power, and security, things that seem desirable, yet Jesus resists. He does not rely on His own strength but on the Word of God, showing us that true fulfillment comes not from earthly things but from trust in the Father.

This passage invites us to reflect on our own temptations. What are the things that pull us away from God? The world constantly offers false promises of happiness, wealth, success and comfort but none of these can truly satisfy our hearts. Just as the devil tempted Jesus to put His trust in things other than God, we too are often tempted to seek security in material things or human approval rather than in God's love. But Jesus reminds us that "man does not live on bread alone", our deepest hunger can only be satisfied by God.

The first reading from Deuteronomy calls us to remember God's faithfulness. The Israelites were once enslaved, but God delivered them. During Lent, we are invited to recall how God has been present in our own lives. When faced with struggles, do we remember His goodness, or do we let fear and doubt take over?

Paul, in the second reading, reassures us that salvation is not complicated. "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." Sometimes we feel unworthy of God's love, but Lent is not about proving ourselves, it is about returning to God with a sincere heart.

As we begin this Lenten journey, let us ask ourselves: What temptations keep us from fully trusting in God? How can we turn back to Him with renewed faith? May this season be a time of grace, where we learn to rely not on ourselves, but on the one who alone can satisfy our hearts.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

<u>St. Mary</u> – 4 PM - **each Friday** during Lent beginning March 7, 2025, Stations of the Cross will be recited followed by Mass.

<u>Good Shepherd</u> -- 6:00 PM – each Friday during Lent beginning March 7, 2025, Stations of the Cross will be recited followed by Mass.

Since we will be in Lent during the Friday Stations/Masses and the pillars of Lent are **Fasting**, **Praying and Almsgiving**, we need to make some sacrifices. It won't be compulsory, but for those who can and want to, the collection basket will be passed during these Friday Lent Masses.

Daylight Saving Time 2025 begins Sunday, March 9. On Sunday, March 9, most Americans will be changing their clocks by springing them forward an hour in observance of daylight-saving time, which lasts until Nov. 2, when they fall back to standard time. Clocks are turned ahead one hour Saturday night, March 8.

Regulations for Fast and Abstinence During Lent

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (April 18) are days of fast and abstinence. ALL the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.
