Reflection for Easter Sunday – Year C

Theme: "The Empty Tomb, the Full Promise"

Alleluia! He is risen! Easter bursts into our lives like the morning sun breaking through a long night. The tomb is empty, but our hearts are full, full of wonder, hope, and the power of new life.

John's Gospel presents us with a beautiful, quiet moment: Mary Magdalene arriving at the tomb while it is still dark. She finds the stone rolled away and runs to tell Peter and John. There is no angelic announcement yet, no risen Jesus in sight, just an absence. But even that absence begins to stir faith.

The Beloved Disciple enters, sees the burial cloths, and believes. What did he see? Not just emptiness, but the sign that death had been defeated. That God had done the impossible. That Jesus, who suffered and died, now lives.

Easter is more than a single event; it is a divine turning point. In the Resurrection, God transforms the greatest sorrow into eternal joy, and the worst defeat into glorious victory. It is the ultimate reminder that nothing, not even death, has the final word.

This Easter, we are invited to look into the empty tomb of our own lives: the places where hope once seemed lost, where pain lingers, where we have stopped expecting God to move. Easter says: "Even here, Christ lives. Even now, God is doing something new."

Let us be people of resurrection, not only today but every day, carrying the light of Easter into a world still waiting for dawn.

<u>REMINDER:</u> GOOD FRIDAY, April 18, is a day of Fast and Abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices are allowed. **Abstinence** is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

RICE BOWLS may be **RETURNED** at any time in the next two weeks. You may write a check for the amount or just place box in the collection basket with your change. **PLEASE** be sure to put **your name** on the box.

Thank you for all of your prayers and sacrifices during these 40 Days. Below is a glimpse of what God has done during our spring vigil.

Compared to the fall vigil, we doubled the number of participants. We had:

- at least 126 participants (72 praying at the vigil site, and 54 at home)
- prayer warriors from at least 20 different Christian churches
- people praying at the vigil site everyday!!
- 26/40 days at least four hours of public prayer recorded
- 38 NEW people praying at home & at the vigil site.

In addition to these numbers, here are some other highlights:

One prayer warrior was able to reach out and pray with a troubled father. Woman
from UK stopped to pray with us before heading to the airport. One of our at home
prayer warriors offered the last moments of her life for the unborn. . We doubled our
pre-organized prayer group opportunities (Thank you!!). More youth involved
