Ascension Sunday – Year C Reflection

Theme: "Why Are You Still Looking Up?"

The Ascension of Jesus is one of those moments that can feel both majestic and mysterious. We imagine the disciples standing there, eyes fixed on the sky, watching their friend, teacher, and Savior rise into the clouds and then... silence. Stillness. Even a little confusion.

And then the angels ask them, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking up at the sky?" It is a strange question. Of course they were looking up! Jesus had just left them, wouldn't you?

But the deeper point is this: Jesus may have ascended, but the mission continues here on earth. He had just reminded them: "You are witnesses of these things." Not spectators. Not passive admirers. Witnesses. Which means: Go. Live it. Share it. Be the proof that love wins.

The Ascension is not about Jesus leaving us behind. It is about Him lifting us up, inviting us into a bigger purpose. And before He ascended, He made a promise: "You will be clothed with power from on high." In other words, You are not doing this alone.

Maybe today you feel like one of those disciples, caught in the in-between. Missing something. Looking up for answers, direction, comfort. That is okay. We all have moments like that.

But the angels' message still rings true: Do not just look up, look around. Look around at the people who need hope. Look within at the Spirit already working in you. Look ahead at the mission Christ left in your hands.

The Ascension is not the end of the story; it is the start of ours. Jesus returns to the Father so that we can be His presence in the world. His hands. His voice. His heart. Let us not stand still. Let us not get stuck staring at the clouds, waiting for someone else to fix the world. Jesus has already given us what we need, His Spirit, His peace, His power.

Now, we live like it matters. We love like He did. We go because He sends us.
